Dr. Lisa A. Conti, a veterinarian, is the former Director of the Florida Department of Health's Environmental Health Division where she supervised over 200 employees and led five Bureaus: Environmental Public Health Medicine, Onsite Sewage Programs, Community Environmental Health, Water Programs, Radiation Control and the Office of Environmental Health Informatics and Preparedness. She was with the Florida State Health Office from 1988 to 2011, and was previously the Florida State Public Health Veterinarian. Dr. Conti has authored or co-authored numerous journal articles on HIV/AIDS surveillance, public health, vector-borne diseases, zoonoses and One Health. She has been recognized as the Florida Public Health Woman of the Year and the AVMA Public Service Award.

Dr. Conti is a member of the National Advisory Environmental Health Sciences Council. She was a founding member and Chair of the national State Environmental Health Directors with the Association of State and Territorial Health Officers. She has been an active member of her local, state and national public health, environmental public health and veterinary medical associations for many years. She sits on the Rabies Compendium Committee of the National Association of State Public Health Veterinarians (NASPHV), was an Executive Board member of the Florida Veterinary Medical Association (FVMA) and established and chairs the FVMA One Health Committee since 1995. She has been a founding member of the Florida Rabies Control and Prevention Advisory Committee. Dr. Conti was a member of the American Veterinary Medical Association (AVMA) Council on Public Relations representing Public Health.

Dr. Conti joined the One Health Initiative team of Laura H. Kahn, MD, MPH, MPP, Bruce Kaplan, DVM, Thomas P. Monath, MD, and Jack Woodall, PhD on January 26, 2012. In that capacity she helps co-manage the One Health Initiative website [www.onehealthinitiative.com](http://www.onehealthinitiative.com) in addition to participating in the team's numerous other One Health projects. As a recognized international One Health leader, author and speaker, Dr. Conti is co-author/editor of a "first of its kind" landmark One Health textbook with the prominent American public health physician at Yale Medical School, Dr. Peter M.
